Occasionally we heard comments such as "we can wait all day" and "over my dead body" as we launched our old boat trying not to look over or get pulled into the predicament.

Being new at this boating thing we had left our lunch in the tow vehicle and had to return around noon to retrieve it, and the standoff was still in full action. They had both assumedly finished their coffee and were working on lunch, as the number of other boaters had come and gone, and the parking lot was mostly full.

We had caught a few fish by total luck, the bait was nearly gone. We had a long drive to get home so headed back to the ramp. AND they were still there! I guess fishermen are persistent and determined. We retrieved our boat and laughed about these two boaters all the way home. Dad taught me about being flexible, using other options to obtain goals, losing a battle to win the war and many more lessons over the years. YES, YEARS! As the weather got colder, I'd ask dad if he thought they were still there at the ramp? When we had a big snow storm a decade later and I was shoveling snow with dad, I told him they were probably still there. And as I once again tell this story.... I smile, thinking of you dad... do you think they're still there?

 $\underline{\textit{Stop \#1}}$ The first stop was to Gary Kosiba's Shop with Boats, Corvette and antique Ariel.










Doug Brook's Shop and what a surprise to discover not only his project boat, but custom guitars with a song!
