will be a really nice event to end the year with friends and over 40 people attending. If you can make it let me know quickly. You will enjoy some really good food and an entertaining awards presentation.

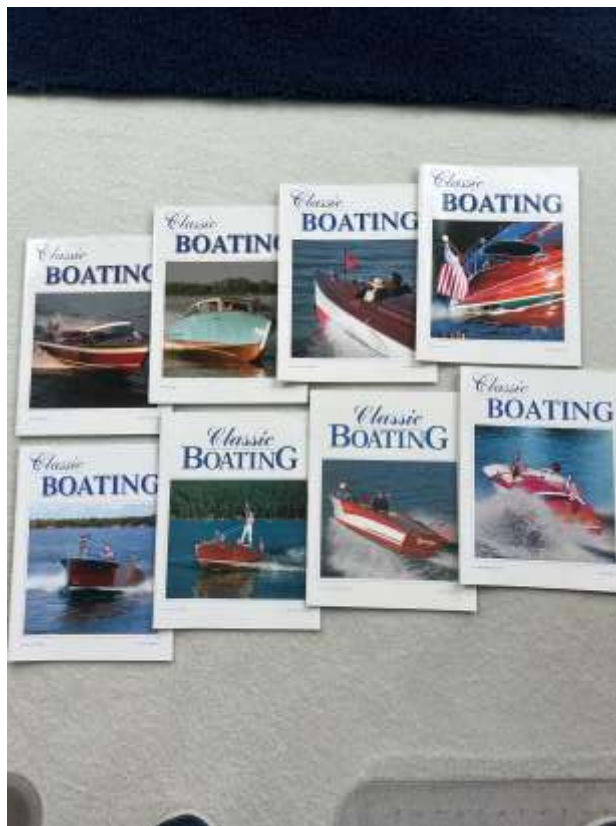
From our Officers, and Directors thanks much for your membership in the Antique and Classic Boat Society and of course our Chapter. Before you know it we will be boating again!

For over 41 years (1984 – 2025) Classic Boating Magazine has published a beautiful bi-monthly, first class magazine devoted to our antique and classic boats. Due to changing interests, younger people are not receiving mailed publications since they get their info through social media and the internet. Classic Boating has been losing money on every issue because of many less subscribers than in the late 80s and 1990s when it was a major source of information, history, advice, and sources for the growing hobby. It was the go-to source for boat show schedules for all of ACBS chapters, books telling the histories of boat manufacturers, how-to articles from engine maintenance to boat restoring, and the most interesting stories of all, the boats themselves.

A number of NCO members have had their boats featured in the magazine, and our Portage Lakes Show had also been in the magazine. I also had a couple of my safety related articles published, which was appreciated. I kept all the issues and over time was able to gather up the whole collection of Issue 1 through the last number 248. In order to get a single issue I was missing and the binders they went into, sometimes I had to buy a group of duplicate issues on E-bay.
